During Mathematics we have been learning about **Inverse Operations.** The operation that reverses the effect of another operation. Example: Addition and subtraction are inverse operations. Start with 7, then add 3 we get 10, now subtract 3 and 1 we get back to 7. Another Example: Multiplication and division are inverse operations.



Opposite operations that undo each other; addition and subtraction are inverse operations; multiplication and division are inverse

operations


Examples:

, so  $9 - 4 = 5$   
 $3 \times 4 = 12$ , so  $12 \div 4 = 3$


